Then he said to his disciples, “The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.”

Can YOU answer all these questions correctly? Have fun!

1. (Sun, 29 Jan.) When God sends the Plagues on Egypt, what land was spared?
2. (Mon, 30 Jan.) In the parable of the Vineyard, the owner of the field hires workers throughout the day. When the day is done and the owner of the field pays the workers, each receives the same amount. How is this like the kingdom of heaven?
3. (Tue, 31 Jan.) For the Israelites, Passover begins at sundown and ends \_\_\_\_\_ days later at sundown. No work is to be done these days except to prepare food.
4. (Wed, 1 Feb.) In the parable of the tenants, there are many key people who at first glance are not self evident. Who are the key people and whom do they represent?
5. (Thur, 2 Feb.) In the parable of the Wedding Banquet, the banquet is representative of the kingdom of God. Why is one of the guests cast out?
6. (Fri, 3 Feb.) In Matthew 22:41 Jesus asks the Pharisees "What do you think about the Christ?" and "Who's son is he?" What is the Pharisees answer to Jesus' question?
7. (Sat, 4 Feb.) What are the seven woes?

Jesus explained the necessity of his coming suffering to the disciples. Peter's denial of that suffering shows his ignorance of God's big picture and his savoring of the things of men, not of God.
